We continue to use Morland Village Hall as our main base with David's 'Great Barn' in Newby for extra sessions and we hope the week will continue to be focussed and fulfilling.

Our philosophy is based on the belief that our dances, old and new, are a priceless inheritance and that our pleasure in dancing them is enhanced immeasurably when we dance them well, concentrating on embodying the music and without the need for constant calling. We aim to give dancers the opportunity to dance the final turns of each dance unassisted by the caller.

lan Jones and Kendal Green will be joined again by Dave and Victoria Yeomans (aka Deo Volente) to provide the music and the musicians' workshops, and, as usual, lan and Vic will add to the roster of callers. Do remember to bring your instruments for Dave's and Victoria's workshops and your voices to join lan's ever-growing band of singers!

We are delighted to welcome back Andrew Shaw. Andrew has been to Morland on several occasions and over the years he has called he has established himself not only as one of the finest of current dancing masters but also an entertaining and witty authority on the dances in his repertoire. Our special feature this year will be Scottish Dancing and we are pleased that Geoff Entwistle will be with us to take those workshop sessions. Geoff is a fine dancer and a sympathetic teacher specialising in making Scottish dancing accessible to beginners and those less experienced in the genre. Timetable

The week begins with Saturday dinner at 6.15 in the Village Hall, followed by dancing from about 7.45. Morning sessions run from 9.30 until 1.00 and afternoon sessions from 2.15 until 5.15.

Daily sessions:

- Dance technique.
- 2. Social dance OR callers' workshop OR Scottish...
- 3. Themed session from invited callers.

4. Harmony singing & band playing (alternate days). There will be dancing, to recorded music, in the main hall if required.

Each evening dance starts at 7.45. Andrew, Vic and Ian will share the calling and Deo Volente and Kendal Green the playing. A special feature this year will be **Norman and Denise Bearon** playing for the Tuesday evening dance with Andrew calling.

Session 3: each day there will be an opportunity for callers from the callers' workshop sessions to try their hand at calling in the hall.

Session 4: please let us know if you would like to join the band workshop session and what instrument you play. For the harmony singing session reading music is not a requirement.

Wednesday is a **free day!** This gives you an opportunity to explore the area and, if you wish, to go to the **Theatre by the Lake** in Keswick for the matinee performance of one of their summer productions.

Accommodation and meals.

We have at Newby End Farm a caravan and camp site with showers, washhouse, WC, electric hook-ups and Elsan disposal point. This is available throughout the season and you are welcome to extend your stay before or after the Folk Dance Week, but **do please book in advance**.

For those who prefer the luxury of bed-and-breakfast, we have a limited number of places in or near Morland where this can be arranged at a price of £27.00 per head per night. When we run out of these, or if you prefer more luxury, there are holiday cottages, other B&Bs and various small hotels in the area. I will gladly send you a list of these on request.

Footwear for Scottish Country Dancing

If you have seen people dancing SCD, you'll have noticed that they wear special shoes. It is not impossible in ordinary shoes, but much more fun this way. If you have looked, you'll see that the men usually wear ghillie shoes and the ladies simple dancing pumps.

If you don't have these, don't be put off! If you can, bring some light shoes with smooth non-stick soles. (Sandals don't really work: they are not firm enough around your feet and their rubber or crepe soles will tend to grip too much on the floor.)

Meals in the Village Hall will again be provided by Jackie Kirkpatrick and her team from Eden Valley Catering. Light lunches cost £5.80, and the 3-course Dinners cost £12.45. You can't get better value than that!
